ARMIDILO-S: An Instrument to Manage Risk for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities

The Assessment of Risk and Manageability for Individuals with Developmental and Intellectual Limitations who Offend Sexually (ARMIDILO-S) is a risk review and community management instrument designed for use with adult males with intellectual disabilities. This seminar will outline the concept and structure of the ARMIDILO-S and various uses of the instrument. Participants will learn what data to collect and how to collect it. Participants will score the instrument from a case study and develop specific recommendations for supervision and risk management strategies. Options for risk report outlines will be discussed.
